Jaymie-Lynn Robertson was a spirited young woman who enjoyed an incredible passion for life and who died too soon at the age of 23 as the result of an accident. She loved working with children and animals. She was diagnosed with epilepsy at the age of 20 but she refused to accept its limitations or allow it to slow down her zest for life. Her resilience was, and will continue to be, an inspiration to all who knew her.

This award will be presented in memory of Jaymie-Lynn to a student whose life has been impacted by epilepsy. This award will not be granted based on academic achievement, but the recipient must demonstrate financial need and submit a 300-word essay on how epilepsy has impacted his or her life.

Additionally, a student must:

- Be between 17-19 years of age entering into college or university studies in a BC post-secondary institution.
- A Canadian citizen.
- Become a member of The Center for Epilepsy and Seizure Education British Columbia.
